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Hello Mr. Jim Stevens

Here is the response to your questions to the EIRB.

1. Once an environmental impact review has begun, the EIRB is unable to meet separately with the developer or any other party associated with the development proposal. As the EIRB review of the Inuvik to Tuktoyaktuk Highway has begun, the EIRB is unable to meet with SC members. However, if and when community public hearings are scheduled for this review, the developer is able to present, in a public forum, any relevant information related to the development proposal.
2. The EIRB review has already begun and the public register has been opened. Any information relevant to the development proposal the developer wishes to submit is welcome and will be posted to the register. Submissions received during the review forms the basis of the information the EIRB will consider in making a review decision, once the review has been completed. 3. Please see response to question 2.
4. The review is basically funded by the federal government but the proponent is responsible for any costs associated with their participation in the review including any public hearings and any documents that they are required to prepare in the course of the review for example the environmental impact statement.

4. How will the cost of related hearings be funded. Is there any proponent responsibility?
