


Figure 1. Private Inuvialuit Lands and Crown Lands within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region.

CHAIR'S COMMENT

The EIRB's work during the reporting period focused on the public review of the proposed development known as "Hamlet of Tuktoyaktuk, Town of Inuvik and GNWT – Construction of the Inuvik to Tuktoyaktuk Highway, Northwest Territories". The review has taken longer than expected to develop a record of information that would allow the EIRB to make a decision and recommendation in accordance with the IFA and Canadian Environmental Assessment Act requirements. The review will continue into the next fiscal year.

The revised Rules of Procedure and Operating Guidelines completed by the EIRB last year have been used to guide the Board through the public review.

Eli Nasogaluak, the EIRB Coordinator, had a busy year managing the large record and registry associated with the public review and supporting the ongoing operations of the EIRB. EIRB continues to benefit from the work and advice of Gordon Stewart (BIOS Environmental Management), working with Eli and our consultants, in the management of the public review. The EIRB has also continued to benefit from sound advice from John Donihee, legal advisor to the Board, in relation to the review and other Board related matters. We appreciate the excellent work provided by these individuals.

During this reporting period Herbert Felix, Roland Kikoak and Bruce Chambers were reappointed for an additional three year term. Jim Umpherson was appointed by the federal government to replace retired long serving member Tom Butters.

As Chair of the EIRB, I wish to welcome Jim to the EIRB. I would also like to thank the Board members and Eli for their work and perseverance in addressing issues that have arisen during the year. As always, the assistance of the staff of the Joint Secretariat over this period is appreciated by the EIRB.

PERIOD OF REPORT

This report describes the affairs of the Environmental Impact Review Board (EIRB) for the fiscal period of April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012.

AUTHORITY OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REVIEW BOARD

The EIRB was established under the terms of the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA) between Canada and the Committee for Original Peoples Entitlement, representing the Inuvialuit. The IFA was approved, given effect, and declared valid by the *Western Arctic (Inuvialuit) Claims Settlement Act* [S.C. 32 - 33 Elizabeth II, C.24.], on June 28,1984. The IFA provides the groundwork for a two-stage Environmental Screening and Review Process that is carried out by the Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) and the EIRB [IFA Section 11.0]. The EISC conducts environmental screenings of development activities proposed for the Inuvialuit Settlement Region. The EIRB carries out detailed environmental impact assessments and public reviews of development projects referred to it by the EISC pursuant to the IFA.

The goals of the IFA, directly relevant to EIRB operations, are:

- to preserve Inuvialuit cultural identity and values within a changing northern society;
- to enable Inuvialuit to be equal and meaningful participants in the northern and national economy and society; and
- to protect and preserve the Arctic wildlife, environment, and biological productivity.

MEMBERSHIP

The EIRB is composed of seven people. Three members are appointed through by the Government of Canada; three members are appointed by the Inuvialuit Game Council (IGC); and a Chair is selected by the Government of Canada with the consent of the IGC. Of the three members appointed by Canada, one is nominated by the Government of Yukon, one is nominated by the Government of the Northwest Territories, and one is nominated by the Government of Canada.

The Husky Lakes Management Plan development is still an ongoing process. The EIRB has developed draft criteria that were circulated for review. The EIRB and Coordinator will review Section 8 of the IFA at a future meeting. Future meeting dates to complete the Husky Lakes Management Plan will be discussed between the Coordinator and the EIRB.

The updates will reflect the current IFA and the updated version of the EISC's Operating Procedures and Guidelines.
