Re: WWF Party Status request (Beaufort Sea Exploration Joint Venture Drilling Program)

Imperial Oil Resources Ventures Limited (Imperial) has submitted a Project Description to the Environmental Impact Screening Committee (EISC) on behalf of the Beaufort Sea Exploration Joint Venture, a partnership among Imperial, ExxonMobil Canada Ltd. and BP Exploration Operating Company Limited. The proposed development, described as the Beaufort Sea Exploration Joint Venture Drilling Program, is to drill an unspecified number of exploration wells in EL 476, known as Ajurak, and EL 477, known as Pokak.

On behalf of WWF-Canada, I request that EISC grant WWF party status in your consideration of the proposed project.

Our reason for requesting party status (as required in Appendix B of the EISC Rules of Practice) is that we can assist the EISC, and later the EIRB, to understand and weigh the risks this project represents to the natural environment and those who rely on it.

As an organization dedicated to conserving the natural world that sustains us, WWF is actively engaged in efforts to manage the potential risks of offshore oil development. Represented by legal counsel at Ecojustice, WWF participated in the National Energy Board's Arctic Offshore Drilling Review, and consequently have an interest in the effective implementation of NEB requirements. As well, we have contributed to the work of the Arctic Council, through its Protection of the Arctic Marine Environment (PAME) and Emergency Prevention, Preparedness and Response (EPPR) working groups. We are a founding member of the Beaufort Sea Partnership. Currently, we are modeling oil spill trajectories in the Beaufort Sea because we believe this project will help to inform decisions about oil spill response preparedness in the ISR.

We plan to engage Ecojustice as legal counsel to help us to participate in the EISC (and EIRB) reviews of the proposed project. We anticipate that we would make written submissions and participate in hearings as the opportunities arise. WWF-Canada staff, legal counsel and technical experts would provide evidence on technical matters, risk management and policy.
